Donald Baillie writes of redemption being 'the tale of God calling his human children to form a great circle for the playing of his game'

In that circle we all ought to be standing, linked together with lovingly joined hands, facing towards the light in the centre, which is God ('the Love that moves the sun and the other stars'); seeing our fellow creatures all around the circle in the light of that central Love, which shines on them and beautifies their faces; and joining with them in the dance of God's great game, the rhythm of Love universal. But instead of that, we have each one, turned our backs upon God and the circle of our fellows, and faced the other way, so that we can see neither the Light in the centre nor the faces on the circumference. And indeed in that position it is difficult even to join hands with our fellows! Therefore instead of playing God's game, we play, each one, our own selfish little game... Each one of us wishes to be the centre, and there is blind confusion and not even any knowledge of God or of our neighbour. That is what is wrong.
